The ADA Standards issued by the Department of Transportation (DOT) apply to facilities used by state and local governments to provide designated public transportation services, including bus stops and stations, and rail stations. Other types of facilities covered by the ADA are subject to similar ADA Standards issued by the Department of Justice. Both the DOT and DOJ standards are based on the Board's ADA Accessibility Guidelines.

Transportation and the Americans with Disabilities Act ...

The ADA Accessibility Guidelines (ADAAG) for Transportation Vehicles serve as the basis for enforceable standards implemented by the Department of Transportation (DOT). These guidelines and DOT's current ADA standards for transportation vehicles are substantively the same. Regulations issued by DOT implement and apply these standards to vehicles covered by the ADA: DOT's Accessibility Specifications for Transportation Vehicles (49 CFR Part 38).

ADA Title II: Public Transportation The transportation provisions of title II cover public transportation services, such as city buses and public rail transit (e.g. subways, commuter rails, Amtrak). Public transportation authorities may not discriminate against people with disabilities in the provision of their services.

Under Department of Transportation (DOT) Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) regulations at 49 C.F.R. Section 37.165(g), a transit provider must permit individuals with disabilities who do not use wheelchairs, including standees, to use a vehicle's lift or ramp to enter the vehicle.

Section 37.165(c)(3) of the DOT ADA regulations allows a transit operator to establish a policy that requires all riders to have their wheelchairs secured while aboard a transit bus or van. Therefore, the operator may decline to provide service to a rider who refuses to allow his or her wheelchair to be secured.
