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Lesson Frameworks There are seven general lesson types based on the four language skills (reading, listening, speaking, and writing) and three system frameworks (Present-Practice-Produce (PPP), Test-Teach-Test (TTT), and Text-based) that can interchangeably be used for the three main language systems : vocabulary, grammar, and functions.

The Framework for Teaching describes those aspects of a teacher's practice that have been demonstrated, through both empirical and theoretical studies, to promote student learning. It divides the complex work of teaching into four major domains—planning and preparation, the classroom environment, instruction, and professional responsibilities—each of which contains five or six smaller components (see fig. 1).
